Registered parishioners preparing for matrimony must contact the rectory at least six months before a proposed wedding date.

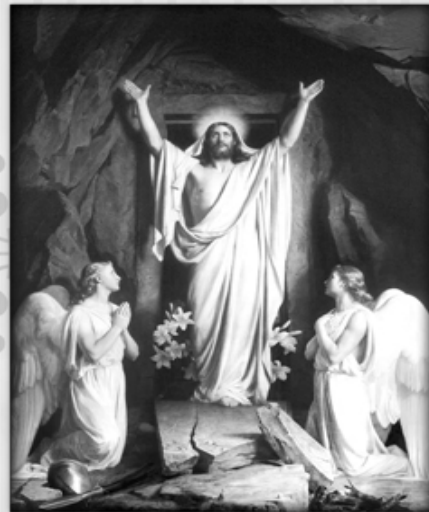
Please do not set a marriage date before you consult a priest.
