“At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. We are not to wait in church for others to join us in the gift of our faith, but we too are sent, apostles, to bring what has the greatest meaning in our life, the Person of Christ.
