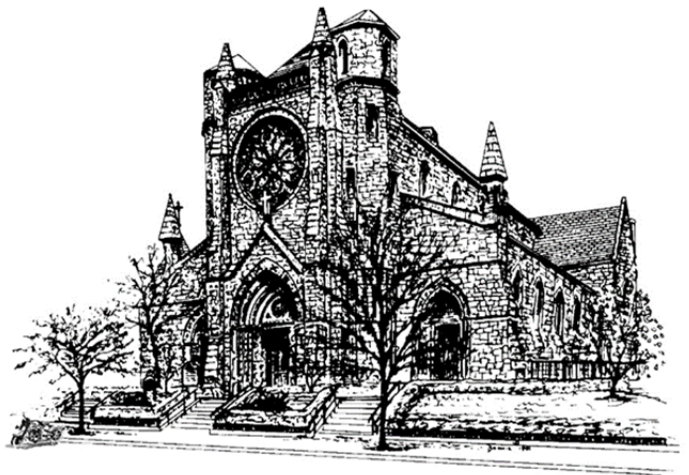
Matrimony
