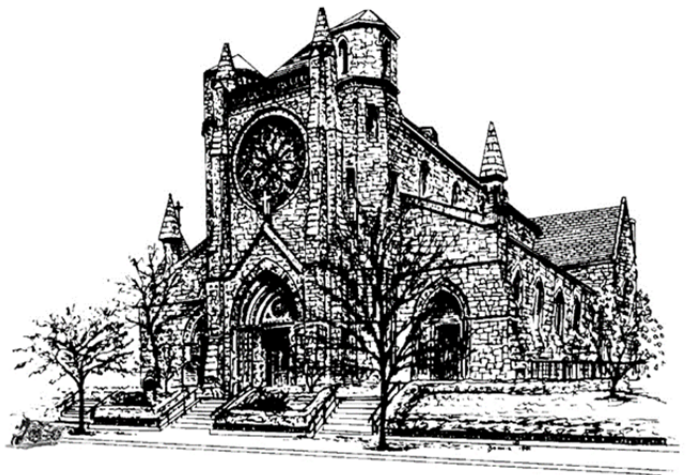
Matrimony
