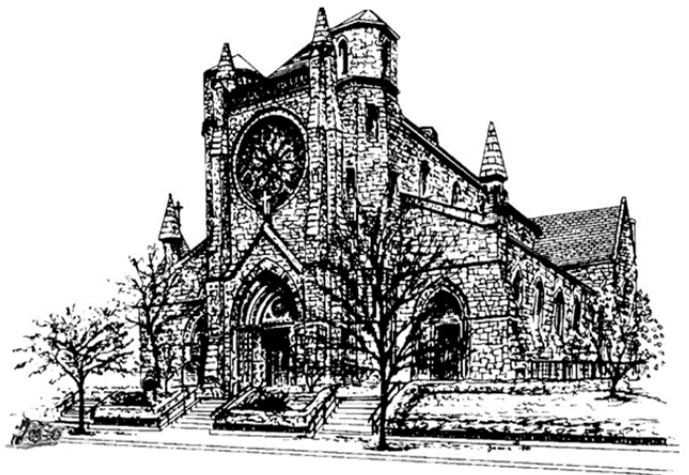
Matrimony
