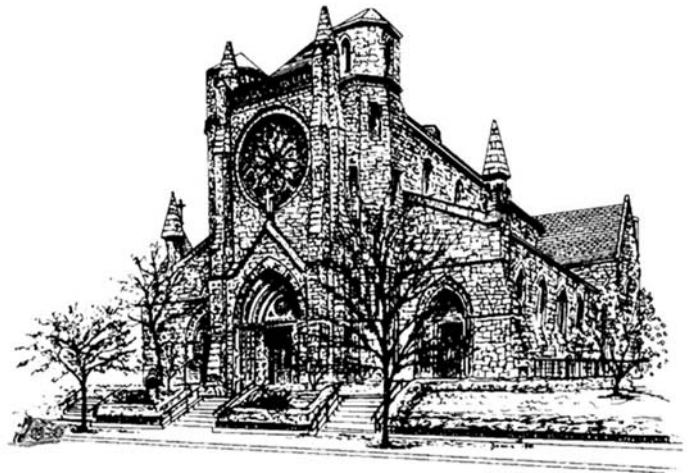
Registered parishioners preparing for matrimony must contact the rectory at least six months before a proposed wedding date.
